

In January of 2023, Charlie, a U.S. Army Veteran, faced a situation no veteran should ever encounter—homelessness. He came to Vetwork seeking help and hope, and we welcomed him with open arms, ready to support his journey of recovery and reintegration. Our first step was addressing his immediate needs. Charlie received nourishing meals from the Bill Reeves Food Pantry and a place in our Mount Zion Transitional Housing Facility, more than just a shelter but a steppingstone to a new chapter in his life.

At Vetwork, we believe in a holistic approach to support. For Charlie, this meant addressing his basic needs and empowering him to regain his independence. We provided essential clothing, transportation to medical appointments, and assistance in setting up a new bank account, crucial for financial stability and independence. However, the most significant support we offered was constant encouragement and guidance. For someone like Charlie, battling uphill, these gestures of support were lifelines, bolstering his confidence to face each new day.

Charlie's transformation at Vetwork was remarkable. He grew stronger each day, not just in meeting life's practical demands but in his sense of self-worth and purpose. Our team worked closely with him, identifying his strengths and interests, leading to tailored job training and career counseling. This personalized approach set him on a path to meaningful employment.

As Charlie rebuilt his life, the community at Vetwork stood with him, celebrating his victories and providing support during setbacks. This sense of community and belonging was crucial in his journey. In early 2023, Charlie took the next step forward. He left Vetwork as a beacon of hope and resilience, with gainful employment and stable housing. His story is a testament to the power of support, community, and the human spirit's capacity to overcome.

Charlie's journey mirrors that of many veterans who come to us in their darkest hours. His story is a powerful reminder of why we do what we do at Vetwork. It's about transforming lives, one veteran at a time. 


We regularly welcome veterans to join us at the office for a cup of coffee. This informal setting builds community while also allowing veterans to learn more about Vetwork.

Our CEP provides educational services to local organizations and advises veterans about services available to them as well as spread awareness of our organization




In 2023, we began a monthly peer-to-peer support group, and it has gained great traction in the community. It also serves as an avenue for veterans to seek out other Vetwork services.
